EXT. CHICAGO STREETS -- DAY

It is late summer 2015. The Windy City is all hustle and bustle.

INT. DESIGN OFFICE -- DAY

EXT. KINDER RUN -- FOLLOWING SATURDAY -- DAY

Saturday roles around and when Chris shows up to the 5K he realizes the race is for a bunch of kids. He finds himself with no other choice but to run it. His buddies are all in the background making fun of him, and Cameron wears an enormous smirk.

Chris starts running with the kids. As the run goes on he comes up to a water stand that Emma is working at. The top ten runners from last week's marathon operated the water stand. This is what Emma meant when she asked Chris if he'd be there. She giggles at him and he tries to play off the miss understanding. Cameron is also working the stand. Smiling and hitting on Emma as Chris prepare to continue the run.

Chris goes forward with the race, running hand-in-hand with the kids, letting them all pass him. When he crosses the finish line, he goes over to Cameron and scolds him for making him look stupid in front of Emma. EXT. BASKETBALL COURT -- SAME DAY - AFTERNOON

Cameron is playing ball with his friends, Chris excluded. He is telling them all the stupid stuff he is making Chris do to embarrass him and make running harder.

INT. DESIGN OFFICE -- DAY

Meanwhile at work, the deadline for the big deal Chris landed is quickly approaching. However, he is too distracted and worn out to realize the time crunch he is really in.

INT. CHRIS'S HOME -- EVENING

Emma calls up Chris and offers him a spot in a marathon the week after the mud run. He knows there is no way he can be in good enough shape to place at a marathon, but blinded by love, accepts.

INT. CHRIS'S HOME -- NIGHT -- EVENING

We are now at Chris's first design deadline. He starts to lose it. He is tired and just wants to tell EMMA the truth. Cameron pushes him to stay on track and finish what he has started. Worn out, Chris presses on.

INT. DESIGN OFFICE -- NEXT DAY -- AFTERNOON

At work the next day, Chris gets a call from his client asking if proofs of their design are almost ready. Chris finds himself extremely behind at work so has to pull an all-nighter in order to have something on the table for the client before he can be approved to put down a final product. The next morning Chris presents the draft of his design, but the client is not satisfied with it. He begins to feel more defeated.

EXT. MUD RUN -- SATURDAY -- AFTERNOON

It is now the day of the mud run. Chris has gotten in better shape but when he comes up to the race he did not realize it was an obstacle run. He can run on flat ground but hasn't properly prepared for this. Looking defeated Cameron approaches him. H is also running the course.

Emma and a small group of her friends arrive and meet up with the two of them. They participate in small talk prior to activities beginning. Cameron begins hitting on Emma, who seems to be laughing at every joke he cracks, even when Chris is the source of the joke.

The run is ready to start. Chris does fine keeping up at first but soon stumbles when he gets to the harder obstacles. When they hit the slippery climbing wall, which ends in a pile of mud, Chris falls behind. He tells Emma to go on and he will catch up. Cameron presses on with the group, making fun of Chris for falling behind.

Cut to scene of group having a blast in the obstacle course, pulling each other through the mud, and joking around as they sling water and dirt into the air.

Cameron is cracking jokes left in right, winning the hearts of Emma's friend group as he shows off. Cameron seems to develop a crush on Emma. However, though Emma smiles at his jokes, she recognizes his arrogance.

Chris is still struggling and is far behind the group. The group goes through the final obstacle and crosses the finish line together. They all hang out cheering on the competitors while waiting for Chris to cross. He comes through about 10 minutes behind the others. They all greet him and give him a hard time for being so far behind.

Chris makes up a story saying he got stuck helping a few people struggling to get through the mud crawl. Cameron

fires back with a response that counters his story. Emma chimes in and says it was all in good fun and everyone did great.

INT. CAR -- EARLY EVENING

They are silent in the car. To make matters worse Chris is getting text messages from work the whole way home asking about his designs.

When Cameron drops Chris off at home, before getting out of the car, he lets loose on Cameron. He yells at him for always undermining everything he does and trying to sabotage his attempts at making relationships. Cameron fires back highlighting Chris's incompetence.

Chris is on edge; he is tired of Cameron always stealing the spotlight. Chris starts to stick up for himself. Cameron keeps going, "You are too big of a pushover. You're never going to win because you let everyone else take what can be yours." They banter some more. Cameron says, "If you want the girl, then grow a pair and go get her, but I'm not backing off."

Chris is taken aback by his friend's response. He stands there for a minute before responding, thinking about the truth behind his friends' statement. "Then may the best man win."

INT/EXT - NEXT FEW DAYS

Chris is also hanging out with Emma over the next few days. They are going on short runs together and just having fun. You can tell there is a spark between the two of them. There relationship comes across as more sincere.

However, during one of Cameron and Emma's outing, Chris stumbles upon them. Watching them interact through the window of a bar, he suddenly becomes discouraged.

INT/EXT -- CONTINUED

We enter a cliché character montage where Chris thinks about everything. He sits at his desk drawing design after design for work, crinkling each one up and throwing it in the trash. He thinks about the girl he's falling for. He thinks about all the things he said to his friend, and his friend said to him.

Cameron is having fun with Emma but realizes she's not that into him. He decides he wants to reach out to Chris and make amends. He leaves a few phone calls but Chris won't pick up. "Buddy, come on this is stupid, just pick up your phone. Let's go to the bars or play some basketball..."

Cut to another montage. This one of Cameron evaluating his friendship with Chris over the past few years and all the times he may have been to rough on him. Here we see clips of flashbacks/memories, a moment of self-reflection before his complete change of heart.

It has been a couple days since the friends have talked. We see scenes of them both at work trying to catch back up with everything. Chris's spirit is crushed. He is struggling for the first time at keeping his head above water at work. He seems to be in a creative block and has a deadline to meet in three days.

EXT. BASKETBALL COURT -- LATE AFTERNOON

It is Wednesday, three days before the race and deadline. After work, Chris takes a slow walk to the basketball court he and his friends usually played at during the week. From the opposite direction the Cameron is walking towards the same place. Chris arrives first and starts shooting baskets, missing most of them. Cameron walks in behind him. The two friends talk out their fight and workout the problems they have had, both admitting their faults and both promising to ease up. Chris says he wants to give up on Emma and doesn't know what to do about work. Here we see Cameron turn in character. He sincerely wants to help his friend and together they figure out how to tackle both issues.

EXT. NEXT DAY --

The two train for the rest of the week, in between the working days. We see marked progression in Chris's athletic efforts, as well as a new energy at work.

INT. FRIDAY NIGHT -- DESIGN OFFICE

After pulling an all-nighter on a final design, he has a finished product to give to his client. He shows them the design first thing Saturday morning and they love it. They sign off on the deal and he sells his work. Scene ends with Chris checking his watch and rushing to the race.

Cameron is waiting outside the office. Chris runs out expressing his excitement on selling the deal and the two head to the race. He gets there just in time to take his mark next to Emma. The whistle blows and the runners dash off.

After 25 miles of running Emma comes to a stop. Chris realizes she is no longer next to him so stops and looks back. He watches as she stands there and the other participants zoom by them. He slowly approaches Emma, and asks, "What are you doing?"

She stands there and says, "Cameron told me the whole story...you don't have to pretend to be this guy..." He looks behind in the distance at his friend, giving him a nod of appreciation for helping clear the air. He apologizes to Emma for lying.
